Conveniently situated on the western edge of Cortland County, with properties located in Tompkins County – the Center offers 12,000+ visitors a year free-of-charge access to a 375-acre, geographically unique, and ecologically diverse outdoor oasis. From grade-school children, college students, and seniors – to individuals, families, or groups – our visitors, friends, and members know how valuable the great outdoors is to their lives, the community, the economy, and future generations.

Known for its marl ponds, streams, peat bog, beaver ponds, and diverse wildlife and plant life - the Lime Hollow Center currently encompasses and protects hundreds of acres of unspoiled land. Current resources and points of interest include:

- **OVER SEVEN MILES OF WELL-MARKED TRAILS** – our most popular feature! Informative viewing stations and displays interpret the ecosystem for you. (Maps provided.)
- **VISITOR & ACTIVITY CENTER** – with interactive exhibits and nature specimens. (Soon, we'll be moving to a new location also featuring a gift shop!)
- **OUTDOOR AMPITHEATER & NATURE PLAYGROUND** – a favorite of visiting children and a staple of our day-camps and public programs.
- **CHICAGO BOG** – a truly unique geological feature, with an equally unique wildlife and fauna profile and self-guided interpretive Arthur Phillips Jr. Memorial Trail.
- **A DEDICATED STAFF** – augmented by a corps of volunteers and guest naturalists, Lime Hollow's full and part-time staff are credentialed professionals well-practiced in environmental education and adventure camp management. (Plus, they're just "good people!")

YOU BELONG AT OUR SCHOOL PROGRAMS AND ADVENTURE DAY CAMPS.

Respect for nature – and, in turn, nature's positive impact on us – starts when we're children and lasts a lifetime. That's why the Lime Hollow Center has made school programs a top priority.

- ENVIRONMENTAL FIELD TRIPS – over 3,000 school children visit the Center each year on day-long or short-term field trips led by trained, paid instructors and naturalists.
- NATURE'S KEEPERS & TRAVEL TRUNK PRE-SCHOOL – throughout the year, these programs enable parents and youngsters to bond with nature and strengthen family relationships.
- ADVENTURE DAY CAMPS – attendance at these popular, nature-oriented summer and school-vacation day camps (ages 4-12) is at an all-time high!
- OTHER EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES, TOO – hundreds of high-school and college students also augment their studies at the Center, including students from SUNY at Cortland, Ithaca College, Cornell University, TC3, and regional BOCES. We also offer visits for outdoor groups and clubs.

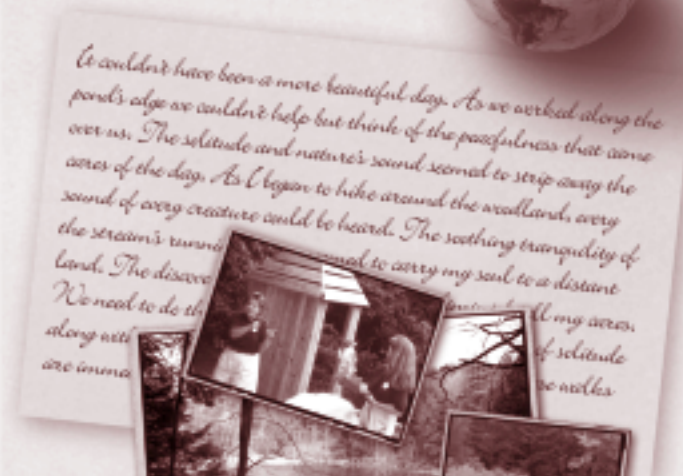
